

### LOCAL GOVERNMENT FINANCE SETTLEMENT

The Rural Services Delivery Grant for 2024-2025 has been increased by £15 Million to £110 Million. We continue to campaign to see the principle extended to all rural authorities. We will continue champion the needs of rural communities, campaigning for fairer rural funding.

### **APPG FOR RURAL SERVICES**

RSN provides the Secretariat for the APPG for Rural Services. The group came together 3 times in 2023 to promote debate on the provision of rural services. Meetings focused on: Off Gas Grid rural properties, Rural Transport and Rural Fair Funding

RSN is part of the Rural Coalition, a group of 13 national organisations.
