The scale of the housing crisis in rural England

- The number of rural households on local authority waiting lists in England increased by 31% between 2019 and 2022, far exceeding the increase in predominantly urban areas of 3%.
- Renting and home ownership are increasingly unaffordable.
- Rising homelessness in rural areas.



Other challenges for rural housing providers


- Quality of existing homes and decarbonization.
