What is the Priority Services Register?

- A register that 'vulnerable' customers can sign-up to
- Offers extra information and assistance when supply is interrupted
- Covers electricity, gas and water network operators (not the retail companies)
- Monitored by the utility sector regulators

Vulnerable groups can include:

- Those aged 60 or over
- Families with young children
- Those with a long term disability or condition
- Others, such as those with sight or hearing loss

Early reflections and comments
