Key Learning Points

T.E.D Ageing Better Project in East Lindsey

- <u>TED Talk East Drink programme</u>¹³. Part of the Ageing Better, National Lottery funded project. East Lindsey first district to join UK Network.
- For every £1 invested there is a **social value return** of £5.52.
- Chief Medical Officer's annual report 2021 cites TED as a blueprint for tackling loneliness and social isolation: Health in coastal communities 14.
- Ageing without children in rural Lincolnshire: an exploratory study¹⁵.

Research into the Impact of Covid-19 on Older People

- Some results from research showed that during Covid-19, physical health: 23% became less fit, 33% more anxious, 23% living with pain.
- Mental health research: 41% lonely, Dementia sped up, increase in depression.
- Carers more isolated and struggling with greater burden of caring.
- Older people wanting to be fitter but finding it hard to get active, loss of confidence. Want better access to health services and face-to-face visits.
- Age UK: Housing in Later life report (2014)¹⁶.
- <u>Rural Shop Report 2022</u>¹⁷ by Association of Convenience Stores -informal networks.
- Result was 32% feeling positive and hopeful for the future but a long way to go for others.
- Age UK Research will be published once decided on how to best show the data/topics.

Regeneration of Godolphin Cross

- Godolphin Cross had lost shops, limited facilities, and poor bus services.
 Opportunity to buy former chapel and create a community hub.
- Local people raised funds to buy and refurbish e.g., solar panels, catering kitchen, accessibility entrance.
- Mix of paid staff and volunteers a good position to be in.
- Cornwall Community Foundation 18 provided support.
- Successful bid to Prince's Countryside Fund¹⁹.
- Successful Farmers' Market and Post Office run by Association.

 used by community. The Association subsidises the Post Office and pays the
 rent.
- Acknowledgement needed of the voluntary sector and its capabilities.
- Current volunteers are older and need next round of people to step forward.

- Bank Hubs have been used in some rural areas to support banking in local communities.
- Important to understand data at the right levels e.g., Chief Medical Officer's annual report mentioned in TED presentation.

Any Other Key Outcomes from the Seminar

RSN's Revitalising Rural Campaign²¹ Specific Policy Asks of the Government is for fairer distribution of national resources to rural areas and more nuanced national policies. There are 14 Chapters in the campaign; three of them look specifically at Managing a Rural Older Population²², Access to Health and Care²³ and Parish Councils and Rural Community Action.²⁴

As new Government strategies are announced, RSN puts them through a "Rural Lens Review" which adds depth and texture to the Policy Asks. A fresh crosscut of the Revitalising document being worked on will look in more depth at younger people. It will also look at the impact of various issues on younger people and develop case studies (personal experiences) rather than dry policy discussions. One of these reviews looks at the Adult Social Care Reform White Paper. 26
