




Things we need to fix...

- Over-reliance on private car
- Limited options for alternatives (which narrows further if you are less mobile owing to age and disability)
- Fragility of existing alternatives
- Getting more (social) value for public spend
- Reducing emissions





Three ideas about the future...

- Greater integration
- Better collaboration
- Doing innovation differently



Greater integration

- Bus market reform
- Whole network approach public, community and shared transport, alongside and connected with active travel
- Bigger role for demand-responsive?
- Mobility hubs (Como UK resources and accreditation)





Better collaboration

- Collaboration in commissioning and provision can combine and meet needs in a better, more integrated way
- This has modelled over the last year in local coordinated responses to the pandemic
- Strong links between local public bodies and community organisations enables more coordinated and integrated support for residents and communities
- Kruger report calls for a more collaborative and trusting model of service design and commissioning
- Total Transport?



Doing innovation differently

- Policy-makers must be open-minded about where innovation may be found and how it can be tested and supported
- Build on best of what's there already
- Localised, place-based approaches to creating positive change
- Relentless focus on creating social value and sustainability of models which deliver this
