What is FCN?

- FCN is a voluntary organisation and charity that supports farmers and families within the farming community through difficult times.
- FCN has over 400 volunteers, located throughout England and Wales.
- FCN runs a national helpline (03000 111 999) which is open every day of the year from 7am-11pm.
- Known for being confidential and trusted.
- 2020 marks FCN's 25th anniversary.



Vulnerabilities in farming

- Farming is an inherently risky and volatile industry to work in.
- Farmers are regularly forced to deal with issues on the farm that are beyond their control, such as animal disease, supply chain challenges, fluctuating market prices and the weather.
- Farming can be a very isolating and lonely occupation with limited social interaction.
- Mental health challenges such as stress, anxiety, depression.
- These are times of immense change planning ahead is a challenge.



- Volunteers are on hand to provide free, practical and pastoral support to anyone who seeks help.
- FCN's helpline (03000 111 999) and e-helpline (help@fcn.org.uk) are open every day of the year, including Christmas Day, from 7am-11pm.
- Helpline volunteers are on hand to listen and provide a sympathetic ear, whether the issue is personal or business-related.
- Calls that come through the helpline are often referred to a local volunteer, who will arrange a meeting with the caller. All cases that come to FCN are treated with complete confidentiality.
- Our volunteers will "walk with" those who seek our help and support them for as long as it takes.




About the work of FCN



Mental health research



- New research led by FCN and the University of Exeter explores how farmers manage social isolation, loneliness and mental health issues.
- Conducted by the Centre for Rural Policy Research (CRPR) and scheduled to conclude September 2021.
- Interviews will be conducted with farmers and families in Devon and Cornwall.
- Findings will be used to ensure we can best support the farming community and suggest interventions.
