- · Modify targeting and design of new policies and investment programmes, to eliminate investment bias to cities and larger settlements
- · Choose inclusive metrics and indicators of required benefits, economic or operational outcomes
- · Offer dedicated investment funds for rural areas to strengthen interdependencies between places
- · Build capacity of rural businesses and peripheral communities to develop, apply for and manage investments (eg by restoration of rural Local Action Groups





- Trends of young people migrating out of rural areas for higher education, skills training and employment
- Lack of transport options can limit access to education, skills, training, employment and leisure facilities for young people
- Poor digital connectivity in rural areas can impact the way that young people can access learning, services and social activities with friends. It had a significant impact on some young people unable to access home learning during the pandemic.
- Access to affordable housing in rural communities so that young people can stay living in rural communities if they wish





- Average house price in rural areas £90k more expensive than urban one (Excluding London)
- Importance of Rural Exception Sites for delivering affordable housing in rural areas
- RSN jointly commissioned research into case for investing in rural affordable housing
- Important role of community led housing to tackle local issues of loneliness, unemployment and provide training





- Urban areas in 21/22 will still receive some 61% (£107) per head in Settlement Funding Assessment grant more than their rural counterparts
- Rural residents will pay, on average, 19% (£96) per head more in Council Tax than their urban counterparts due
- to receiving less government grant
- Ten fold increase in Rural Services Delivery Grant since start, now at £85m
- Unfair funding, means total discretionary spend is almost 3 times greater per head in urban authorities compared to rural
