

Fuel Poverty and Energy in Rutland

Aim: A county-wide project that raises awareness of energy issues and provides help to those most at risk of fuel poverty.

- Project began in January 2012 and aimed to help at least 200 households in Rutland directly through home energy audits.
- Build on good practice from elsewhere and provide a rural response to issues of Fuel Poverty.
- Whilst energy prices will continue to rise, this approach addresses fuel poverty, public health and environmental agendas in one.

What we have achieved to date:

- Undertaken over 400 household energy audits as a result of direct mailout, word of mouth, trust and brand, media campaign and referrals from other organisations.
 - 25% average energy reduction (potential)
 - 92% satisfaction from householders
 - £167 average bill reduction through tariff switching
 - 14% on wrong meter economy 7
- Trained 40+ frontline staff (carers, volunteers, council staff) on how to give basic advice on fuel poverty and refer householders to us
- Initial £10,000 has attracted a further £120,000 for Rutland
- National Energy Action's National Community Footprint award
