














Cumbria Action for Sustainability (CAfS)



- Celebrating: 20 years of driving a shift towards a zero carbon Cumbria
- **Growing**: 13 staff, 30 contractors, 4000 supporters
- Active: 20-30 live projects
- Influential: Co-chair countywide leaders group on climate change

Community Energy Cumbria (CEC)



CAfS seed-funded the establishment of CEC in 2015 and have since supported them, and other community energy groups to raise almost £1 million in community renewable energy shares to build Cumbria's first community-owned hydro scheme and four solar energy schemes, engaging hundreds of people in community ownership of renewable energy.

Alston Moor Greenprint – helping to create a greener future for Alston Moor

- Three-year project led by CAfS to create a vision for a green and sustainable future for the area, with practical actions and solutions to make it happen.
- Funded by the Esmée Fairbairn, the Greenprint is part of the new community plan being developed by the Alston Moor Partnership (AMP).
- Community-led solutions to the challenges of a dwindling population, cuts to statutory services and transport links, low local employment, fuel poverty.
- Solutions include: green waste management, businesses and transport, food growing, energy efficiency in older buildings, energy efficiency planning, trialling innovative architecture, community renewable energy schemes



The Purpose and Objectives of Cumbria Climate Change Working Group:



To plan and oversee a radical programme of action that will enable Cumbria to become a carbon neutral county and to mitigate the likely impact of existing climate change. In order to do this, the group will:

- Propose a shared definition of "carbon neutral"
- Propose a target date by which this is to be achieved
- Commission a baseline carbon audit for the County and agree ongoing monitoring mechanisms
- Identify leadership for developing action across key topics
- Establish a programme of action by key partners
- Lead joint campaigning to encourage wider public awareness and action.
