Rural Transport

From Andrea Vincent, Olney Town Council:

As a Market Town we have gradually lost all the transport services that enabled us to be a hub for our neighbouring villages. Without transport to bring folk into the town we cannot provide the services.

From Brian Angell, Clun Town Council with Chapel Lawn:

On the issue of transport there is some disconnect with planning so although Highways are consulates, they only look at immediate access not the wider impact of traffic and public transport needs. Would be interested in any survey to know if that is something others find and how best we can get better integration.

From Cllr Lisa O'Donoghue, Buckingham Town Council:

Yes, please on transport, especially when s106 funding goes, then the service goes!

From Cllr Mike Thompson, St Austell Town Council:

I know that there are "test" areas for the introduction of hydrogen into the public transport system, and how can the infrastructure be developed to ensure that Rural Market Towns can ensure that they have the opportunity to take up the program if it is proved to be an answer in the Carbon Zero target? I guess it also could open up the whole Climate change agenda for all rural market Towns.

Outcome

RSN will seek to run a survey and consult RMTG member on the topic of Rural Transport.

Planning

From Julie Holden, East Grinstead Town Council:

I'd like to see some pressure for CIL/S106 where building to border affects the towns infrastructure over the border from new small settlements. the new planning paper has referenced a new CIL, but of course nothing about cross border payments to be mandatory.

From Cllr Diane Ward, Uckfield Town Council:

I would also be interested in the thoughts of the group about planning. We are possibly going to get so many houses, if they are all passed the surrounding villages will not be villages it will become part of our town. Also, how can we get help with trying to get affordable housing. We need houses for our children rather than 4 and 5 executive homes.

From Cllr Alison Trenery, Uttoxeter Town Council:

Sounds Like Neighbourhood Plans and how they are being ignored is an issue to look at.

Affordable Housing

From Kim Fletcher, Cranbrook and Sissinghurst Parish Council:

A MAJOR ISSUE is the inability for local people to afford to buy homes. Developers build for incomers (From London) and then 'affordable homes' which are not for sale, so non locals with lots of 'points' get foisted into a rural location, where they do not want to be. As a result, our 'artisans' and children are priced out of the market. Parliament does not understand this issue as we are losing our future population to wealthy incomers and social housing

High Street and Business

From Brian Angell, Clun Town Council with Chapel Lawn:

Whilst Transport is crucial and should be an early focus, I think at the current time support for high street and business would be very useful.

From Cllr Philip Wicks, Richmond Town Council in Yorkshire:

Richmondshire District Council is planning to invest in EV charging points. We believe it is important to tourism, as well as benefiting residents who do not have drives/garages.

From Julie Holden, East Grinstead Town Council:

JPI media survey nationally has shown significant changes in wants and needs for working from home and the changing face of the high streets in market towns.

From Cllr Richard Elvin, Hetton Town Council:

As the only Town/Parish Council in our authority we get very little support form them. How can we ensure they offer us the support they should do in keeping with National Government guidelines?

From Christian Barnes, Kirkby Stephen Town Council:

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Prior to Lockdown we were beginning a transport audit with 'Action with Communities in Cumbria' (ACT). One prospect we have been considering is the use of smart technology to hitch rides. Do any councils have experience of these kind of services.

From Keli Nolan-Lyons Tenterden Town Council Town Centre & Tourism:

Proof in the pudding as I keep cutting out - any updates on rolling out more broadband in rural areas?

From Christian Barnes, Kirkby Stephen Town Council:

I'd be keen also to know what other councils experience of providing EV charging points has been. Please could this be included in any survey activity?

From Cllr Jonathan Davies, Penrith Town Council:

Could an online collaboration forum be established out of this group to continue the conversations between meetings?

From Sally Thurston, Faringdon Town Council:

I have just completed a dissertation on the regeneration of Market Towns for Community Governance Degree. Once market this month I am happy to circulate my findings and recommendations via this group if helpful.

From Cllr Jenny Bartlett, Leominster Town Council:

2011 Localism Bill? set out some markers for principle / parish relations.

From Cllr Robert Hull, Hexham Town Council:

Does the work just described consider the changes the pandemic will produce for market towns?

From Cllr Jonathan Davies, Penrith Town Council:

Has RSN engaged with the CLA who are under the rural powerhouse agenda they have duplicating a lot of what has just being outlined here as the RSN policy/agenda.

From Cllr Tony Hirons, Lutterworth Town Council:
