
A simple guide to RSN online spreadsheets – An analysis of average earnings

As part of the Rural Service Network's series of neighbourhood planning evidential spreadsheets, we have created an analysis of average earnings. The analysis uses four drop down lists to select either the mean or median average, the authority for which data is required, the population group for which data is provided, and the option to select between the hourly, monthly or yearly gross pay.

This brief guide is designed to aid you in navigating to the information required in creating your own neighbourhood plan.

If you select with your mouse pointer any of the four option cells, a grey square with a blue triangle will appear to the right of that cell.



The spreadsheet provides both the resident and workplace based earnings for the local authority you have selected.

It also provides comparative information in the form of the Predominantly Rural, Significant Rural, Predominantly Urban averages, the ranking in terms of similarly classed authorities, its nearest ranking neighbours, as well as the top fives for each rural/urban classification. I hope this guide has been useful, and that the data provided from our evidence bank has aided the creation of your own neighbourhood plan.
